- REASON: Internally displaced persons in Ukraine who have been forced to leave their homes due to the war leave with a minimum of belongings in search of safety. In foreign cities, they are often left without support and financial resources.

Assistance with baby diapers is welcome for families with young children, as it addresses basic health and hygiene needs of children. Pillows, towels and bed linen create conditions for comfortable rest and personal hygiene, provide a sense of dignity and promote health in difficult circumstances. Providing such essential items helps internally displaced people adapt to new living conditions and feel supported and cared for.

- REASON: Together with our partner organisations in Zhytomyr, we help civilians and defenders in eastern Ukraine who need quick and nutritious meals but do not know how to cook them.

Restrictions on the supply of goods and the dangers associated with mining and shelling make it difficult to provide for these essentials on their own. Humanitarian assistance is therefore critical to meeting the basic needs of the population and maintaining their health and dignity in these difficult times.

- REASON: Due to the war and the fact that Zaporizhzhia is a frontline city, there are many animals in the region that have lost their homes or owners. The Zaporizhzhia shelter takes care of more than 200 dogs and cats that need help with their upkeep. Food is a constant problem. Due to the large number of animals, the shelter cannot support itself on its own, so they regularly ask for food donations.

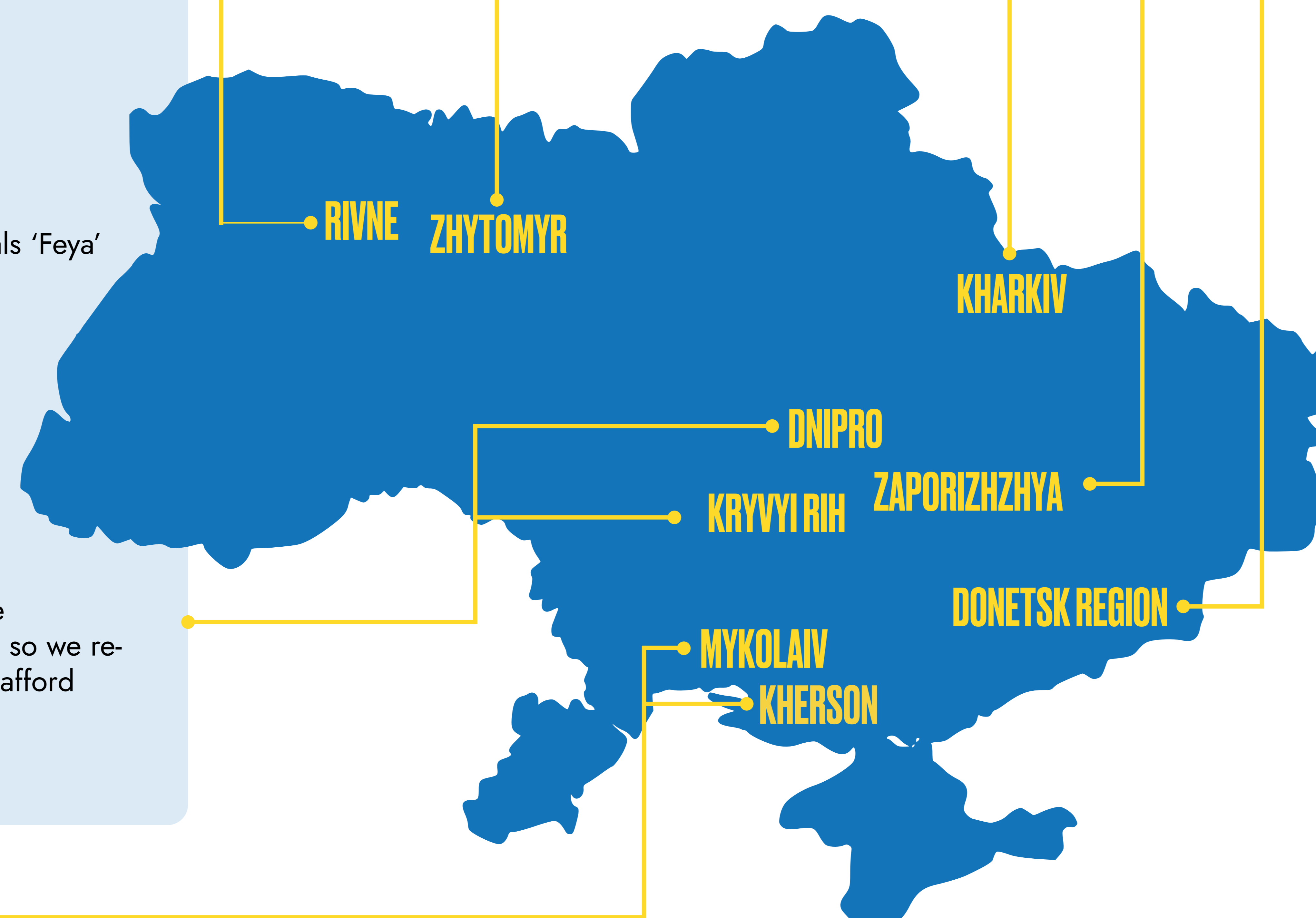

 - REASON: The wounded often arrive at hospitals and emergency rooms with severely damaged clothing. In these regions, relatives rarely come to hospitals to bring clothes, so the wounded are forced to stay in their wards because they don't have clothes even to go for a walk and get some fresh air.
- This is a basic thing that all hospitals and medical centers need.

- REASON: The Kherson and Mykolaiv regions are among the most heavily shelled areas of Ukraine. Many people have lost their sources of income and access to shops, making it impossible to purchase even the most basic necessities such as food, personal care products and household chemicals. Restrictions on the supply of goods and the danger posed by mines and shelling make it difficult to provide these basic necessities on their own.

12 INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT THE HUMANITARIAN AID DEPARTMENT'S WORK SINCE 2023:

- In 2023, **over 30 tons** of humanitarian aid were sent
- The number of vehicles with humanitarian aid dispatched this year: **over 80**
- The average amount spent monthly on delivering humanitarian aid to Eastern Ukraine is **30,000 crowns**
- The minimum number of people involved in sending a single cargo of humanitarian aid to Ukraine - **7 people**
- The average number of requests from organisations and volunteers received by our foundation monthly - **25**
- The smallest contribution sent for humanitarian aid in 2023 - **4 crowns**
- The largest donation for humanitarian aid in 2023 - **60,000 crowns**
- The cheapest item purchased by our foundation for humanitarian aid was instant soup (**5 crowns each**)
- The most expensive purchase made by the foundation in 2023 for humanitarian aid was a vehicle for medical needs (**110,000 crowns**)
- The total number of people who donated in 2023 - **636 individuals**
- The number of days in 2023 when the humanitarian aid department operated - **344 days**
- The number of volunteers involved in the activities of the humanitarian aid department:
 - ~30 in the Czech Republic
 - ~65 in Ukraine
